
The Mighty One- Crown and Scepter

'El' is translated into English as 'God'. Its letters originally were the image of an Ox (representing strength) and a Shepherds Staff (representing authority) and meant 'The Strong Authority' or 'The Mighty One'. ノン





The concept of the Ox and the Shepherd Staff in the word has been carried over into modern times as the crown and scepter of a monarch, the leader of a nation. These modern items are representative of the horns of the Ox, an ancient sign of strength, and the Shepherd Staff, an ancient sign of authority. -Jeff Benner, 'The Ancient Hebrew Alphabet'.

Gen. 46:32-34 "and the men are **shepherds**, for they have been keepers of livestock; and they have brought their flocks and their herds and all that they have.' 33 "And it shall come about when Pharaoh calls you and says, 'What is your occupation?' 34 that you shall say, 'Your servants have been **keepers of livestock** from our youth even until now, both we and our fathers,' that you may live in the land of Goshen; for **every shepherd is loathsome to the Egyptians**."

The reason Joseph told his family members to say they were keepers of of livestock, rather than "shepherds" is as follows: Sheep will eat grass right down to the ground to the point of hurting or even destroying the grass, where-as cattle leave the grass long enough so it isn't damaged. That is why sheep must have a shepherd to constantly move them around. They will destroy the grass if not overseen. That's why cattlemen and shepherds don't get along very well. That's why Joseph said to his fathers clan to tell the Egyptians they were cattlemen, not shepherds.
